Job 1 :1

In the land of Uz there lived a man whose name was Job. This man was blameless and upright; he feared God and shunned evil.

Job 2 :10

He replied, “You are talking like a foolish woman. Shall we accept good from God, and not trouble?”

Job 3 :24 – 25

For sighing has become my daily food; my groans pour out like water. What I feared has come upon me; what I dreaded has happened to me.

Job 4 :18 – 19

If God places no trust in his servants, if he charges his angels with error, how much more those who live in houses of clay, whose foundations are in the dust, who are crushed more readily than a moth!

Job 5 :17

“Blessed is the one whom God corrects; so do not despise the discipline of the Almighty.

Job 6 :29 – 30

Relent, do not be unjust; reconsider, for my integrity is at stake. Is there any wickedness on my lips? Can my mouth not discern malice?

Job 7 :17 – 18

“What is mankind that you make so much of them, that you give them so much attention, that you examine them every morning and test them every moment?”

Job 8 :20

Surely God does not reject one who is blameless or strengthen the hands of evildoers.

Job 9 :2 – 3

Indeed, I know that this is true. But how can mere mortals prove their innocence before God? Though they wished to dispute with him, they could not answer him one time out of a thousand.

Job 10 :12

You gave me life and showed me kindness, and in your providence watched over my spirit.

Job 11 :13

Yet, if you devote your heart to him and stretch out your hands to him.

Job 12 :13

To God belong wisdom and power; counsel and understanding are his.

Job 13 :3

But I desire to speak to the Almighty and to argue my case with God.

Job 14 :1 – 2

Mortals, born of woman, are of few days and full of trouble. They spring up like flowers and wither away; like fleeting shadows, they do not endure.

Job 15 :14

What are mortals, that they could be pure, or those born of woman, that they could be righteous?

Job 16 :20

My intercessor is my friend as my eyes pour out tears to God.

Job 17 :9

Nevertheless, the righteous will hold to their ways, and those with clean hands will grow stronger.

Job 18 :5

The lamp of a wicked man is snuffed out; the flame of his fire stops burning.

Job 19 :25 – 26

I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God.

Job 20 :4 – 5

Surely you know how it has been from of old, ever since mankind was placed on the earth, that the mirth of the wicked is brief, the joy of the godless lasts but a moment.

Job 21 :22

Can anyone teach knowledge to God since he judges even the highest?

Job 22 :21

Submit to God and be at peace with him; in this way prosperity will come to you.

Job 23 :12

I have not departed from the commands of his lips; I have treasured the words of his mouth more than my daily bread.

Job 24 :19

As heat and drought snatch away the melted snow, so the grave snatches away those who have sinned.

Job 25 :2

Dominion and awe belong to God; he establishes order in the heights of heaven.

Job 26 :5

The dead are in deep anguish, those beneath the waters and all that live in them.

Job 27 :3 – 4

As long as I have life within me, the breath of God in my nostrils, my lips will not say anything wicked, and my tongue will not utter lies.

Job 28 :28

And he said to the human race, “The fear of the Lord—that is wisdom, and to shun evil is understanding.”

Job 29 :12

Because I rescued the poor who cried for help, and the fatherless who had none to assist them.

Job 30 :20

I cry out to you, God, but you do not answer; I stand up, but you merely look at me.

Job 31 :3

Is it not ruin for the wicked, disaster for those who do wrong?

Job 32 :8

But it is the spirit in a person, the breath of the Almighty, that gives them understanding.

Job 33 :14

For God does speak—now one way, now another— though no one perceives it.

Job 34 :21

His eyes are on the ways of mortals; he sees their every step.

Job 35 :12

He does not answer when people cry out because of the arrogance of the wicked.

Job 36 :15

But those who suffer he delivers in their suffering; he speaks to them in their affliction.

Job 37 :5

God's voice thunders in marvelous ways; he does great things beyond our understanding.

Job 38 :1 – 3

Then the Lord spoke to Job out of the storm. He said: Who is this that obscures my plans with words without knowledge? Brace yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer me.

Job 39

Not text to memorize.

Job 40 :4

I am unworthy—how can I reply to you? I put my hand over my mouth.

Job 41

Not text to memorize.

Job 42: 5 – 6

My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you. Therefore, I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes.
