

THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

DESCRIPTIVE SHEET

Author

The author of the book is called John Mark. Mark was not one of the twelve disciples of Jesus. However, he was a companion of Paul's ministry (Acts 13:13; 15:38-40; 2 Tim. 4:11), Barnabas, his cousin (Col. 4:10) and the apostle Peter, for whom he was the secretary (1 Pet. 5:13). (1 Pet. 5:13).

Date

In the category of gospel writings, Mark is considered the first author. His gospel is dated between the years 50-60.

Core theme

Mark presents Jesus as the suffering servant who comes to serve others.

Target audience

The Gospel according to Mark seems to target a Roman audience.
